



ABOUT THE SURVEY ON FOOD QUALITY AND TRANSPORT EXPECTATION

OS officers routinely conduct interviews and surveys onboard vessels to understand the concerns of seafarers and to identify ways to assist in resolving them. In January this year, SOS initiated a survey on food safety and hygiene as part of our union's efforts to study the effectiveness of the Maritime Labour Convention (MLC) 2006 and its long-term effects on seafarers.

The survey - which stems from observations made during ship visits as well as the recent hype in food safety and quality onboard - aims to identify the best practices and challenges encountered by ships' cooks in the galley.

These findings, to be shared to shipowners, would also be shared with the shipping community at large to help improve their daily operations onboard vessels.

Our officers are also conducting a transportation

satisfaction survey to explore ways to improve access to shore-based welfare facilities and amenities around the city.

We hope the findings can improve existing port facilities, including transportation services and timeliness, to allow visiting seafarers to commute within and beyond the port when their vessels call in Singapore.

We appreciate the integral role seafarers play in keeping the economy moving and that ports have a duty of care in ensuring their well-being is looked into.

So far, shipping companies have expressed their support for the survey, with many partaking in the initiative by offering to distribute survey forms to their crew. "It is a good initiative. We are looking forward to getting the results," said Mr Giancarlo Brosolo, Managing Director, CMA-CGM.





OKIKI CHINA CELEBRATES 12TH ANNIVERSARY









hina's leading early childhood education institute, OKiKi China, celebrated its 12th anniversary on 20 January 2018.

The celebration kicked off with a symbolic OKiKi 'family' photograph with some 500 teachers, staff and directors followed by the company's annual luncheon at Marriot Hotel in Downtown Shanghai.

In his welcome address, Founder and CEO, Mr Forest Yuan recapped OKiKi's stellar performance since 2006, highlighting each milestone with noteworthy photos and impressive financial figures. This includes Seacare's 10 per cent stake acquisition of OKiKi China in June 2015.







He explained the growth of China's preschool market in the past decade—in tandem with the country's economic growth and prosperity, identified OKiKi's current market position in Shanghai, and outlined strategies to make the school 'Anything but Ordinary' for the decades to come.

"The rapid increase of social capital flowing into the education sector has seen more parents seeking OKiKi schools and our enrolment figures climbing. But we cannot be complacent, we must strive ahead and improve our service quality and training syllabus," he said.

"The preschool education market today is saturated with new entrants. There used to be five players in the market, but there are now 20 or more vying for the same piece of the pie and offering a much lower rate."

"At the same time, China's economic growth has dropped from 10 per cent a decade ago to the current 6 per cent, which means the growth of our education market is correspondingly slowing," he added.

"With more highly-educated parents demanding better education for their kids, and with the stiff competition, would we still use yesterday's syllabus and learning concepts to teach our students?"

Receiving applause and nods of approval from the floor, Mr Yuan laid out a 10-year masterplan to place OKiKi at the forefront of the industry and to transform it into a respectable, world-class organisation.

"We have to be the leader, not the follower. We have to run faster, it will be more taxing, there will be rapid growth, we will keep developing staff and strengthen corporate culture..." he said, taking a leaf from IBM's book to recognise, reward and retain dedicated employees, who are paramount to the success of the organisation.

He expounded on OKiKi's mission to be 'the most valuable and honorable world-class service provider of Kids and Happy Families' and emphasised the need to always observe OKiKi's core values: a winning mindset, strong team



spirit, enterprising attitude, intense commitment and honorable ethics.

Mr Yuan or 'Teacher Yuan' as he is affectionately addressed, also empowered everyone to take massive actions - to make a big difference to the lives of preschoolers, every day.

"The philosophy of Learning with Laughter forms an essential and natural part of the learning process, one which is deeply embedded in our culture and a cornerstone of our success."

arlier in November 2017, OKiKi officially opened its fourth and biggest campus in Pudong, Shanghai.

The 10,000-square metre campus in Zhangjiang Hi-Tech Park - known to be China's very own Silicon Valley - is fringed by the city's top-rated academic and research institutes, start-ups and a multitude of global establishments.
